


Amber Morczek, PhD



Dr. Amber Morczek earned her Ph.D. in Criminal Justice and Criminology from Washington State University in 2018. Dr. Morczek's teaching and research interests involve studying the connection between cultural norms, technology, and manifestations of violence toward women. Her research has been published in the *Journal of Interpersonal Violence*, *Family & Intimate Partner Violence Quarterly*, the *International Journal of Cyber Criminology, Sexuality & Culture*, *The Criminologist*, and the *Sexual Assault Report*. Dr. Morczek has delivered presentations to the several state and federal agencies: the Utah Coalition Against Sexual Assault, the New York State Coalition Against Sexual Assault, the Illinois Coalition Against Sexual Assault, etc. Dr. Morczek has received awards, including the 2016 Washington State University Martin Luther King Jr. Distinguished Service Award and the 2018 State University of New York College at Buffalo Young Alumnus Achievement Award.

Dr. Edna Erez is Professor of Criminology, Law, and Justice at the University of Illinois at Chicago. She has law degree (LL.B) from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, and MA and Ph.D. in Criminology/Sociology from the University of Pennsylvania. Her areas of research include victims in justice proceedings, violence against women including immigrant women, and terrorism and transnational crimes. Her publication record includes over 100 scholarly articles, book chapters, and research reports. Professor Erez serves as associate editor of *Victims and Violence*, co-editor of *International Review of Victimology*, and co-editor of the *Oxford University Research Encyclopedia of comparative criminology*. Her two most recent National Institute of Justice funded research projects addressed the use of GPS technologies in domestic violence cases, and the convergence of transnational crimes.

Dr. Kristina Box was named Indiana State Health Commissioner by Governor Eric J. Holcomb on September 18, 2017. She brings to the role a passion for improving the health of Hoosiers, beginning before birth. Dr. Box has been a practicing obstetrician and gynecologist in Indianapolis for 30 years, starting her career at Community Hospitals of Indianapolis in 1987 as a private practitioner with Clearvista Women's Care. Since 2015, she has served as the Physician Lead for Community Health Network's Women's Service Line. In this role, she built the first multi-disciplinary women's center in the Community Health Network, developed critical partnerships with area children's hospitals to improve care and decrease health care costs, and led efforts to ensure that low-income women receive the important free health screenings they need. Dr. Box has been involved in ongoing surgical medical missions to Haiti and Bolivia for more than a decade.
